



Roughly one-third of the food produced in the world for human consumption every year - approximately 1.3 billion tonnes - gets lost or wasted.

## 2021 RESEARCH

When food ends up in a landfill, it decomposes and releases methane emissions, a greenhouse gas that is 28 x more potent than Co2 over a 100-year period. Worldwide, 8.2% of greenhouse gas is from food waste.

#### **30% OF ALL WASTE**

Is food and only **4.1%** of that is composted in the world. In Estonia it is mandatory.


### Food waste in Germany, Slovenia and Estonia

In Germany, around 12 million tons of food waste are generated every year. Per capita, that means that each German wastes around 55 kg of food every year.

In Slovenia, there are around 139,900 tons of food. There is an average of 68 kg of food waste per year for one person.

In Estonia, they produce around **84,000 tons** of food waste. In 2015, an average of **54 kg** of food waste was generated per person in a year, of which 36 percent consisted of wasted food.
