Security - Similarities

- Account deletion and deactivation
 - Deactivation is not permanent
- Passwords
 - Long, no words containing letters and numbers
- Login/-Alerts
 - a code on your phone
- Blocking
 - Lets you block a certain person
- Spam
 - Reportable fake content
- Phishing
 - Fake posts to obtain information
- Information
 - Preventing government from accessing data
- Two-factor Authentication
 - SMS with a code is sent to the phone

Security - Differences

Facebook

- **Trusted Contacts**, Choose 3 to 5 contacts to be trusted to contact in case you get locked out
Each friend will get one piece of a code
If you bring them together, you will get the full code and be able to recover the account.
- **Unfriending-** If you unfriend someone on Facebook, they can still see your profile and images (if you are not on private mode), but you will no longer see their posts.
- **Phishing**, fake Facebook sites can steal your account details, if you press the “like-button”, it automatically starts to download malware.

Twitter

- Tweets can be private and/or in a certain location
- Discoverability
- Personalisation
- DMs
- Twitter Teams
- Safe-Search
- Mute Accounts/Words

Threats - Similarities

- Hackers
 - Identity theft
- Fake News
- Spam Mails
 - Don't trust every e-mail
- Scam
 - Don't tell anyone your account details
 - Keep your account safe from friends
- Malware/Virus
 - Keep your PC safe to secure your account details

Threats - Differences

Facebook

- Don't accept all requests
 - If you don't know the person
- Don't post everything about yourself
 - Posts good moments but not all of your life
- Make all personal details private
 - Posts
 - Personal information
 - Address
 - Mobile number
 - Place of work/working hours
 - Relationship (status)

Twitter

- Threats of violence
 - People wish for death or disease of an individual or group of people.
- Impersonation
 - Trolls can make fake accounts to damage the reputation of famous people.

Threats - Differences

Facebook

- Don't fill everything in
 - When you register
 - When you provide your personal data
- People can damage your image
 - Don't tell everybody private details about yourself
- Keep your password safe
 - Don't tell anyone your password
 - Make a safe password

Twitter

Violations- Similarities

- Harassment or abuse of other people
- Post graphical content that may end up being harmful
- Posts that show violence and physical harm
- Hate speech against people based on:
 - Gender
 - Sexual orientation
 - Race
 - Ethnicity
 - Religion
 - Nationality
 - Disabilities
- Abuse and hateful conduct
 - Unwanted sexual advances
 - Hateful conduct
 - Hateful imagery and display names

Violations - Differences

Facebook:

- Fake/impostor profiles
- Threats or direct attacks towards groups of people
- Posting copyrighted content
- Organizing crime via Facebook
- Bullying

Twitter:

- Malware phishing - Don't publish links to malicious content which damages or disrupts the other person's computer.
- Don't use pornographic or violent media in your profile picture.
- Don't post tweets that include racial slurs and pictures.
- Unlawful use
- Misuse of Twitter logos
- Misuse of usernames
 - The number of accounts created
 - The creation of an account for the purpose of selling accounts
 - Using someone else's name on account
